These moments create lasting memories and help shape a positive path forward. They remind children that they are part of something bigger than themselves, a family and a community that walks together in faith and care.

At St. Joseph School, we strive to authentically live our motto: We Are Family. Staff, students, and parents work in partnership to model and strengthen the values of courage, kindness, humility, and respect. These are the qualities that tell our story to the wider community and guide how we learn, play, solve problems, and support one another.

Family Week will be celebrated from Monday, February 16 to Friday, February 20, a special time to recognize and appreciate the important role families play in our lives and in our school community.

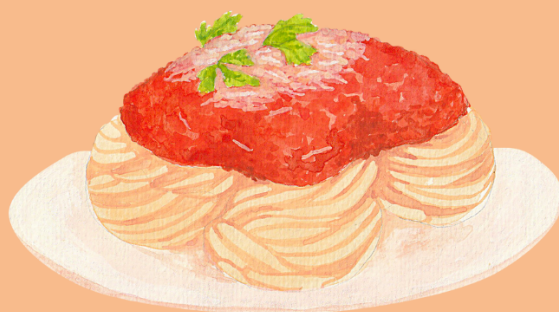
