November 2025 Principal's Message

As we wrap up our Halloween celebrations and we move closer to Christmas season it is important that we take a moment to slow down and take the time to celebrate and honour Remembrance Day.

For the vast majority of us, our experience with war is limited to two or three minute segments of darkness and devastation as seen through the lens of a television camera or through a journalist's account of fighting in distant parts of the world. For those of us born during peacetime, all wars seem far removed from our daily lives. The minute the images make us uncomfortable, it is as easy as pushing a button, to switch the channel and tune it out.

Once a year we set aside a day to formally recognize, remember, and give thanks that we are able to live in a country where we are free to attend school, vote, speak our mind, play, and worship. Once a year we are asked not to switch the channel. We often take for granted our Canadian values and institutions, our freedom to participate in cultural and political events, and our right to live under a government of our choice. The Canadians who went off to war in distant lands went in the belief that the values and beliefs enjoyed by Canadians were being threatened. They truly believed that "Without freedom there can be no ensuring peace and without peace, no enduring freedom."

These wars touched the lives of Canadians of all ages, all races, and all social classes. Fathers, mothers, sons, daughters: they were killed in action, they were wounded, and thousands who returned were forced to live the rest of their lives with the physical and mental scars of war. The people who stayed in Canada also served - in factories, in voluntary service organizations, wherever they were needed. By remembering their service and their sacrifice, we recognize the tradition of freedom these men and women fought to preserve. They believed that their actions in the present would make a significant difference for the future, but it is up to us to ensure that their dream of peace is realized. On Remembrance Day, we acknowledge the courage and sacrifice of those who served their country and acknowledge our responsibility to work for the peace they fought hard to achieve.

It is in remembering and telling the story that we discover who we are and the meaning of our lives. It is in recalling the past that we best see what the way into the future is. It is in remembering what happened and why it happened, that we find the principles and the guidelines by which our lives should be governed.

As I invite you to join our St. Joseph's family on November 6, 2025 at 1:15 pm for our Remembrance Day Liturgy, which will be led by our grade 9 class, I am reminded of someone else who died for us – died so that we might enjoy eternal freedom - Jesus Christ. The Remembrance Day liturgy will be followed by our quarter 1 faith in action awards and our 2024 – 2025 Junior High Academic Awards. The awards will begin around 2pm.


Good luck to all of our volleyball players and keep working hard and improving your skills!

POEDs at SJS

Definitions:

POED: **Personally Owned Electronic Devices** we are referring to personally owned cell phones, tablets, laptops, and wearable technology such as smartwatches or earbud.

The following will be the policy followed at SJS:

Grade 1-5

Students are not to bring personally owned electronic devices to school.

Grade 6-9

Students are required to leave their devices in their lockers unless explicitly given permission by their classroom teacher.

Cell Phones are **never allowed** in washrooms or changerooms. If parents/guardians need to get ahold of their child during the school day, they must do so by contacting the office.

Cell phones may be stored in the locker but **NOT IN POCKETS**.

POEDs Permitted during the following:

- 8:00am-8:20am: school is open for the Breakfast Program
- **Personally Owned Electronic Devices** are not permitted during the 1st half of lunch hour while students are eating.
- Students will have access to their devices during the second half of lunch as well as during the two, 10 minute breaks during the day.

A telephone for student use is provided in the office. If the parents/guardian need to contact the student, please call our school office at **403-345-3373**. The office staff will relay only messages to students, which originate from parents/guardians.
