

In addition, participation in the survey was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Evaluations have not been calculated as 2020/21 survey results are not comparable with other years.
- 3. Participation in the 2019/20 Diploma Exams was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. In the absence of Diploma Exams, achievement level of diploma courses were determined solely by school-awarded marks. Caution should be used when interpreting high school completion rate results over time.
- 4. The "N/A" placeholder for the "Current Result" for PAT and Diploma Exam measures are included until results can be updated in the Fall.
- 5. Aggregated PAT results are based upon a weighted average of percent meeting standards (Acceptable, Excellence). The weights are the number of students enrolled in each course. Courses included: English Language Arts (Grades 6, 9, 9 KAE), Français (6e et 9e année), French Language Arts (6e et 9e année), Mathematics (Grades 6, 9, 9 KAE), Science (Grades 6, 9, 9 KAE), Social Studies (Grades 6, 9, 9 KAE)

Courses included: English Language Arts 30-1, English Language Arts 30-2, French Language Arts 30-1, Français 30-1, Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, Biology 30, Science 30, Social Studies 30-1, Social Studies 30-2.

# **Board Strategic Priority**

**Goal:** By the end of the 2021/2022 school year, students and staff will grow to have a deeper awareness of their faith and an understanding of the tools we have been blessed with (Fruits of the Spirit and the Litany of the Saints).

## **Goal specific strategies:**

- Fruits of the Spirit awards given monthly. Each month the focus is on a different Fruit of the Spirit
- Bucket Filler awards random draw of names entered for students that do acts of kindness for others
- Staff prayer every second Wednesday morning In person meetings once again in Chapel
- Special prayer services if needed for staff Examples are prayers for family/staff that passed away
- Weekly mass attendance one grade at a time at St. Ambrose on Thursdays
- Continue working on Sacramentals and teaching students Church practices (genuflecting, holy water, ...)
- School Retreat Committee established to allow for anyone that wants to help set up our Retreat Day
- Daily morning prayer and Friday Gospel reading with classes praying individual intentions afterwards on their own
- We have increased our connection with the parish by inviting Father Ian to visit our classrooms on a more regular basis (So far Kindergarten and Grade 9)
- Continue to ensure our school branding matches who we are and helps tell our story
  - All school clothing and uniforms explicitly say St. Joseph School and/or have our SJS logo with the cross embedded. Have eliminated uniforms that simply read Jaguars.

- Social Justice Projects:
  - Christmas Hampers through Santa's Anonymous, Angel Tree and Coadale Food Bank
  - We have once again partnered with Chalice to support a school in Africa (Pangawe School in Tanzania). Our Social Justice class augments our Religious Education and helps to bring our faith to life through actions in our school.

- Encouraging teachers to have FNMI goal as part of IPGP and passing along Aaron and Shelly's information to all staff
- Indigenous Games becoming a regular part of PE classes
- Individual teachers are comfortable taking the lead on teaching and introducing topics regarding First Nations, Metis, and Inuit communities
